

## Worksheet 1 – Mayday Dot, Dot, Dot...

*A storm raged in the night. Huge waves, driven before a bitter south-westerly, rolled across the shallow waters of Bass Strait and thundered onto the bleak East Gippsland coast, dashing themselves on the rocks...Towering 30 metres out of the blackness, their thousands of tonnes crashed down relentlessly.*

An **ellipsis** is a form of punctuation that consists of three small dots written one after the other (it is also known as the **points of ellipsis** or quite simply *dot, dot, dot*). An ellipsis can be used to indicate the deliberate removal of text when quoting from an original source. In the excerpt above, an ellipsis has been inserted to represent the removal of two sentences from the introduction of *Mayday*. The points of ellipsis can also represent an unfinished thought, indicating there is more to come. They can help an author add surprise, mystery and suspense to a text. The author of *Mayday* has used ellipses throughout the story to add a sense of urgency and tension to the retelling of a dangerous and suspense-filled real life experience.

**Task 1:** Rewrite the excerpts below from *Mayday* by inserting an ellipsis between the matching sentences.
